This was a physical battle from beginning to end. Six weeks after the event in Poland where I contracted this really weird bug, I am still fighting for my health and wholeness. This is my fourth event since Krakow and my immune system is under serious pressure and the altitude is another factor. The time in Colorado is packed with meetings both personal and corporate.

This is just another exercise in being kept by the Lord. We always use our faith as a catalyst for intervention with the Father. Sometimes the interposition comes via manifestation and we are healed. Other times it comes via hiddenness, which is a quiet, almost unnoticeable embrace that allows us to live in the moment throughout each day. In these times of being kept by the Lord it is really about a sustained, trusting focus on His goodness. I break the day into morning, afternoon and evening, which allows me to focus all my trust in each segment. I trust God for His keeping power, the anointing of the Spirit and the grace to empower me to be sensitive to Him despite all the external issues. Deliberately engaging in that same routine three times per day gives me access to more presence and power than my under pressure body could ever receive normally. It's allowing our weakness to take advantage of His strength.






When we trust like this it allows us to put the whole physical issue in God's hands and leave it. I don't think about it. I choose to focus on what/who I need to be in the Spirit for each meeting. Partnering with the desire of God for this people group allows us to upgrade the environment in the room and change the atmosphere so that we can take the people on a journey with the Holy Spirit.

In the first session, I spoke on the "The Roots of Passion." Everything comes to us from the Lord. The expression of His heart towards us becomes the assertion of our heart towards Him. We return to Him what He first gave us (1 John 4:19). In Christ we are subject to the same passion that the Father has for the Son. His passion for Jesus creates zeal in us based on His Nature towards us in Christ. We receive passion so that we can become passionate. The fight in this session is particularly against performance Christianity: that religious feeling that I must initiate something towards God so that He will respond favorably towards me.

This must be thoroughly broken in people and the only way to do it is to speak to the Jesus who is present in everyone. The Holy Spirit through us must speak of the Father's passion for Christ in us! It is the lovingkindness of God towards Jesus that must shape our responses. His love generates new faith. His joy in Jesus provokes the capacity to stand in adversity without fear or anxiety. His majesty empowers us to live in the joy and peace in believing.

It is not just the message we bring but the particular aspect of God's nature we use when talking to people. In this particular battle we must connect people to God's affection so that they respond in one of the fruits of the Spirit. This message concludes with a prophetic word from Father, Son and Holy Spirit, which details their desire for us to experience the fullness of abiding in a habitational relationship with them. There was such an incredible sense of God's peace and presence in the auditorium. No one moved for quite a while.

My second message was, "Understanding True Grace...As God Sees It!" Grace cannot be fully explained by people who are not awestruck by the experience of it. It cannot be properly defined by using only logic and reason. It cannot be taught academically. It has to be constantly experienced. That experience upgrades the whole man: body, soul and spirit.

Grace is a perspective that alters our lens on life. It is a mindset that neutralizes all forms of negativity. It is a language that compels us to love God, ourselves and everyone else. Grace is a way of being that perfectly matches our hearts with the nature of God as defined by the fruit of the Spirit.

Grace releases the Beloved in all of us. It is the empowering presence of God that enables us to become the people that God sees when He looks at us. Father looks at us through the lens of Jesus, which joyfully compels Him to treat us in the same way He would treat His beloved Son.

Grace is the story and journey of transformation from sinners to saints, from strangers and aliens to being part of God's household, from being isolated and alone to being a dwelling place of God by the Spirit. Grace provokes the affection of God in a huge way.

We are (like God) rich in grace (Ephesians 1:5-8). Grace is a place where we can stand (Romans 5:1-5). Grace is a ruling power in our lives that releases freedom through righteousness (Romans 5:17-21). Grace gives us confidence and boldness to come before the throne of grace so that we receive all the help we need from the One who knows us best (Hebrews 4:14-16). What would it be like for us to be rich/wealthy in grace? What does being poor in grace actually sound like?

When teaching on grace, the way we modulate our voice must allow people to hear grace as a sound that empowers them to receive it as an encounter through listening. People were audibly responding with joy and weeping. One guy (skinny!) said he felt thirty pounds lighter. Grace removes the negative weights that become attached to us through shame, guilt, condemnation etc. Grace makes our heart light. The natural effect of grace is that we respond in rejoicing to the God who always provides hope - an expectation of something wonderful occurring.



My third session was, "Taking God For Granted." When God grants us something He expects us to take Him at His word - what we perceive that God is for us - to stand joyfully in the place of believing so that we can receive what He most wants to give.

2 Peter 1:2-4 is an astonishing scripture! It is so filled with revelation that empowers us to have a true knowledge of the nature of God towards us. There are two levels of knowledge in the Bible. One is typified by the word "gnosis", which means: "the beginning or the opening of understanding". It is a thought that acts as a catalyst to open us up to a more complete comprehension, which is "epignosis", which involves an understanding leading to an encounter and an ongoing experience that continues to grow and develop into a stronger relationship with God.

I love the idea that God gives us exceedingly great and precious promises so that through them we may know who He is for us and become like Him using the guarantees that He supplies. For someone of God's astonishing integrity, honor and righteousness, a promise is a guarantee that we can take for granted in Jesus. We are therefore being liberated into fullness in our experience of the Lord.

When we believe God we can more easily become like Him. His promises have an impact upon our language. Kingdom language has three expressions that require our response.

Firstly, our confession of His word to our own heart challenges our identity in Jesus to be upgraded so that we walk in faith regarding who God is for us.

Secondly, we proclaim the kind intentions of God to our circumstances; we announce His will, we make known His promises. We proclaim to God in rejoicing and thanks for all that He is purposing within us and towards us.

Thirdly, because we live our lives on the battleground between two kingdoms, we must understand that a warfare statement is required of us in the Spirit. Declaration is the art of acknowledging, affirming and asserting to the enemy the Lordship of Jesus over our lives, and how the purposes of God will impact on him.







We see these expressions in the account of David vs. Goliath in 1 Samuel 17. There is a confession of how God was with him against the lion and bear (verse 34-35), proclamation of how God would be with him versus Goliath (verse 36-37), and finally, his declaration to the enemy (verse 45-47).

The language of promise must be understood and practiced. Promises are our currency in the Kingdom and must be spent in the world. Taking God for Granted is a key part of that process.

My final message on this assignment was, "*The Responsive Life*." It is such a key part of our relationship with the Lord that we understand how the Kingdom is so different than the world. When scripture tells us that we must set our mind on things above and not on things on the earth (Colossians 3:1-3), it is informing us that the Kingdom contains a more powerful way of perceiving and thinking than the world can produce. It is the clear understanding that God's ways are higher than ours (Isaiah 55:8-11), we must think from a high place in our relationship with the Lord.

We live with a creator who is still creating! We must determine that logic and reason are not as powerful as wisdom. Words of wisdom are the first gift mentioned in 1 Corinthians 12:8.

Wisdom is the understanding and practice of how God sees, thinks, speaks and acts. We have to be lifted up into His ways, not seek that He becomes downgraded to ours.

As Creator, the Father always takes the initiative and we respond. Jesus and the Holy Spirit do not take initiative (John 5:19-21; 16:13-15) in their relationship with the Father. Everything originates in God (John 3:27; 1 John 4:19; James 1:17; Romans 11:35-36) and it is our pleasure to respond to what He is doing. In all life situations we are learning how to receive what the Lord is releasing to us.


We are taking the yoke of Jesus upon us and learning from His relationship with the Father (Matthew 11:28-30). When we are abiding in Christ our circumstances connect with our intimacy and passion for Him. Our yoke is easy and our burden is light. I love Paul's confident assertion in 2 Corinthians 4:16-17. It beautifully focuses our heart on constant renewal.





One of my favorite pictures from a TWC training activation is a bench in a lovely garden surrounded by an adobe wall with a heavy timbered door just down the path beyond the bench. It speaks to me because one of my identity statements is "I am a scout looking for Him in each person through listening to peoples' stories." So come sit with me in the garden and let's swap stories while I introduce myself to you.

Isn't God good? That's the best place to start! My testimony is that God is an expert at turning bad things into good and beautiful ones.



In Psalm 16, my inheritance word, I have personalized vs. 8 as "I have focused my life on You and life circumstances will not shake me up." One final identity piece I'd like to share with you is "I am a DOS program running quietly in the background enabling others to do what they were designed to do" so that's why I am fondly titled an "administrative assistant" for TWC. That's just fancy talk for I love reading everyone's email and knowing who's up to what in God's kingdom!
